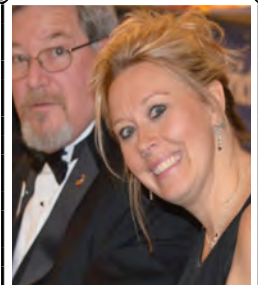

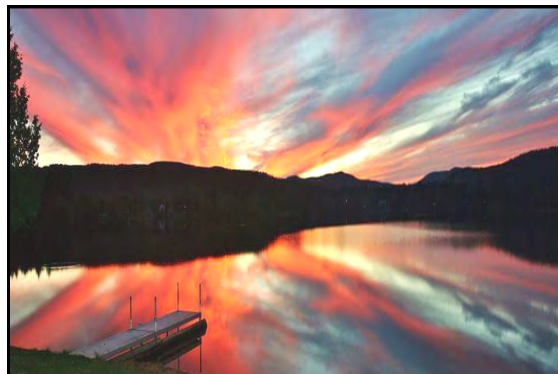
REMEMBER THE DISTRICT CABINET MEETING MARCH 13TH - LEBANON ELKS.

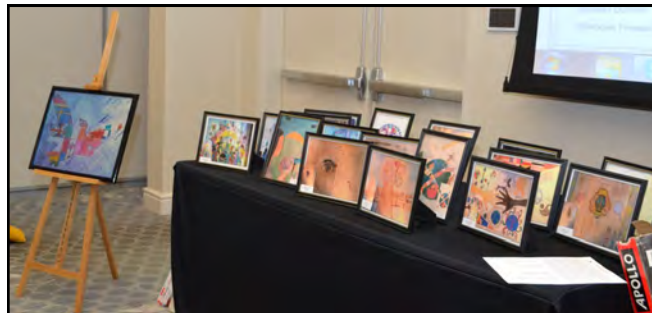

LIONS SIGHT AND HEARING NEWS

For those of you who missed the Midwinter convention, the Lions Sight and Hearing Foundation Annual report for 2014-2015, ending June 30, 2015, it is posted online at <http://nhlions.org/LS%26H.htm>. It is password protected. It can be accessed with user name **nh44lions** and password **44winter99**.



The upshot is that we provided hearing aid and cataract surgeries worth nearly \$175,000, by working with providers to get the cost down to just under \$70,000. By referring some cases, and obtaining help from outside sources, the clubs spent only \$5,400 for these services, with LS&H kicking in nearly \$50,000. What a bargain to the clubs! The recipients are asked to kick in just \$50 per case, a token so that they have ownership.

Twenty five clubs participated, providing 84 hearing aids and 7 cataract surgeries, one laser surgery and 1 collagen cross-linking surgery.

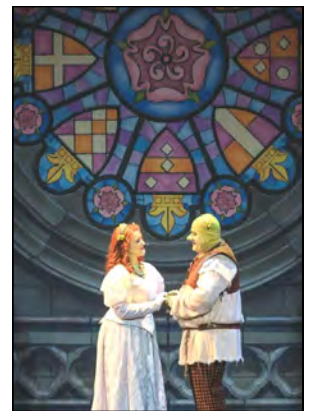
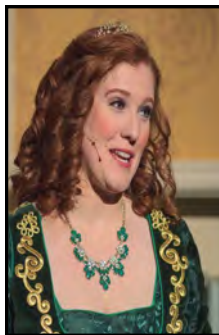
