Hello Fellow Lions,

My name is Judy and I am the chair of the Health Services Board and we also oversee Operation Kids Sight.

The mountain the HSB is climbing involves screening the children of NH. We invite all of you to join us in this climb. The more help we have the faster we will achieve our first goal of screening one hundred thousand (100.,000) children this year.

I will be writing each month to keep you all updated on how many screenings we have done. I will keep you posted on the numbers we have screened, the numbers we have referred to professionals, and the numbers of children we flagged. I hope to inform you all on these terms and how they apply.

Until now, we have been screening as many adults and youths in our schools and towns that we can find. We will be more focused going forward to the younger ages as they are the most in need and may not have been to the Eye Doctor as yet. We have been to county fairs, fall socials, etc.. It has been wonderful learning to use the screeners! We have found many nurses, principles, and daycare directors around the state wanting us to come into their facilities to screen their children. We have added new Lions to our clubs once they have gotten involved in the screening process. We have much work ahead of us. Trainings are being scheduled by the Vision Committee to help those Lions not yet as involved.

HOPKINTON - many thanks to the wonderful folks who came out for the Independence Day weekend Lions Club Pancake Breakfast. The food was great and the company was terrific! Everything was delicious and the proceeds are going to support the Hopkinton Food Pantry. Our Year-End Dinner was held at the Common Man in Concord. Past District Governor, Melody Whitcher presented the Melvin Jones Award to Hopkinton Lion Rosalie Smith and introduced new members Al Sorensen and Rob Blank. Scholarships were also awarded to this years recipients, Lily Mitchell and Jacob Walling.

We are now busy with tending and harvesting at the Henniker Lions Club Garden Project which support both the Henniker and Hopkinton Food Pantries Hopkinton Lion Dik Dagavarian flipping pancakes at the 4th of July Pancake Breakfast

HENNIKER - the Lions garden planting is well underway with work going on each week. A very successful 5K Eye Run/Walk event was held with 100 registrants on the road and great sponsors

GAP MTN - we again did our Troy Summer Festival BBQ on July 1st. Two of our newer members cooked such delicious chicken that when we started serving at 5:30, we had close to 80 people in line. Our members that volunteer every week at our local food pantry are continuing the good work. The need for food assistance in Troy and Fitzwilliam is growing.

ORFORD - entered our traditional float in the Orford/Fairlee 4th of July parade following the theme of "Celebrating 100 years of our National Parks." Topped the float with a large sign of the theme and also "Celebrating Lion's 100 Years of Service. 10 Lions and guests rode on the float while three Lions walked the parade route handing out 200 spruce saplings to "replenish our National Parks." The following Saturday, July 16 the club staffed a refreshment stop (SAG Stop) for the 41st. Prouty bike ride for cancer research. We opened at 5:30 am and closed at 3:00 pm. 5 Lions worked all day and two shifts of 7 Lions and volunteers worked 5 hours each. Serve approximately 3000 riders. The entire event raised over \$3,000,000 for cancer research. 2 Lions attended the LTSSA games. Next up in August will be our annual Lobster Fest run in conjunction with Orford Day Aug. 13 and another Adopt-A-Highway clean-up later in the month.

ANTRIM-BENNINGTON - Lions David & Linda Ward and new club member Cheryl Riley presented a check from the club and items donated by members to Camp Allen. They were then treated to a tour of the camp.

WILTON - we sponsored a project run as the Open Cupboard Food Pantry. Through this project we distribute food to needy families in Wilton, Lyndeborough & Temple. We held a summertime potluck dinner meeting at the home of a member.




