

We received this letter this week from a child with Juvenile Diabetes here in Wilton. We have sponsored Cameron for Camp Carefree for several years.


If any one wonders why we do what we do, and why we are so happy to do it, this letter will tell them.

On Sunday, March 11, the 44N Cabinet Meeting went north to the Common Man in Plymouth, NH.

DG Eric welcomed guest speaker Peter MacDonald to speak about his efforts in helping homeless Veterans and his Veterans Resort Chapel in Lee, NH.

Peter is an ex-Marine and when returning home back in the 70's found himself at one point homeless, living or





existing out of a dumpster, with difficulties trying to reacclimate from his military experiences. With help from strangers and family, along with a few years of struggle, he was able to adjust back into society. To pay it forward, years later, he decided, along with his wife and daughters to help many who also found themselves in the same type of situation. Peter and his wife purchased 11+ acres in Lee, NH and built the Veterans Resort Chapel. A place where a Veteran could come to meditate with their God, find a home, a place out of the woods or a dumpster. Unfortunately. some Veterans find themselves retreating from family or loved ones because of their mental state and lack the mindset to get the care they may need. Peter is providing an opportunity in the hopes that the Veterans Resort Chapel can be this place for them to come, to readjust, to get support and to live freely for as long as it takes.

Peter sent his thanks to the Lions for asking him to be their guest speaker for this Cabinet Meeting. "Teaching others what and how we can help those that gave everything, to have a better life is what it is all about."


