THE FUTURE of PEACE" 2017-2018 PEACE POSTER CONTEST

All participants are now busy creating their artwork for the 2017-2018 "The Future of Peace" Peace Poster Contest. This is the 30th anniversary of the Lions International's Peace Poster Contest!

According to our records, twenty-five clubs are participating with 47 kits sold. The deadline for turning in all posters is November 15th. Your club should judge all posters by this date and select a winner. Many clubs choose a winner as well as a 2nd and 3rd place winner. We are also asking that in addition to these front runners, that you collect all posters from all participants and turn them in. Be sure to use the sticker provided in your kit for the winner (1st place) and all information required is completed before it is turned in for final judging by the District Governor. All other posters should include the printed labels that were in the previous Roar and Pride newsletters or given out for your use. These labels should be placed on the back bottom right hand side of each poster so that they can be easily identified by all. Please be sure that all LCI rules and regulations are followed when judging each poster. For example, size of poster, no writing on the front of the poster, etc. as, unfortunately, they will be disqualified from the contest and that would be a shame!

THE PROCESS: Each poster received will be photographed and framed. DG Sam is looking for someone in their district to photograph their posters but all posters should be directed to Lion Marilyn Richardson or sent to DG Sam regardless.

District Governor Sam Longbook and District Governor Eric Lindberg will select a winning poster from their respective districts. The two winning posters will then go to MCC Christine Greenwood which she will judge and choose the winning poster. After selection is made MCC Christine will forward the final winning poster to LCI to be judged some time in February 2018. Please be sure to advise the winner that their original poster will not be returned to them once it goes to LCI. The winner will receive a nicely framed photocopy of their poster. All other participants will receive back their original posters plus an 8x10 framed photocopy of their poster either after or at the Mid-Winter convention. All winning posters will be photographed and framed for display at the mid-winter convention in January 2018. In addition to the winning club posters, depending upon the number of participating posters received, they too, will be photographed and framed for display. Hopefully, we will have a significant number of posters to display.



This month our story is actually a letter that the Jaffrey Rindge Branch club received and said we could share:


"I am a 38 year old and I have been wearing corrective lenses since the age of 7. Four months ago my glasses broke beyond repair. I am a single, low-income woman and a current eye exam along with new glasses was extremely unaffordable on my budget. Not having glasses was preventing me from new job opportunities and driving. I was referred by a friend to the Lions club for the program that is offered to assist people with vision care. Gratefully I was accepted. I have received a complete eye exam and was given a choice of frames. It took 7 days for my new glasses to come in. Since then I have gone to a job interview and was offered a job pending a vision screening. Without the glasses, the job opportunity would not be possible. I am so grateful to Lions."

Tip of the month: If you have already done the schools in your area, try scheduling screenings at the day cares in your area. That is the perfect age for the screenings to do the most good!!
