#### Musings from VDG Fred Plett





When you draw up your budgets for charitable donations, please include the DogSight Project!



She had taken her child to an ophthalmologist before school started and was found to have no problems. A few weeks later, a screening was done at her child's school and the OKS screener equipment found the need to refer the child. The mother returned with the child to the ophthalmologist and showed him the referral sheet. He rechecked the child for that problem and found that there was indeed a problem. He apologized for missing it during the initial exam and all necessary corrections were taken. The mother stated, 'if not for the Lions, this problem would have gone unnoticed for a longer time."
