# usings from DG Fred Plett

We have had our second Cabinet meeting, and for those of you there, wasn't our quest speaker, Sylvia Pelletier, who founded and is President of the Childhood Cancer Lifeline, just utterly fantastic? For those of you not there, you missed a dynamic talk. Sylvia had two children with cancer and thought she was going to lose one of them just shy of his second birthday, yet they both survived! She relates how one or both parents have to guit work to fend for the sick child (children in her case). She had a third, healthy child, and that child has his own experiences when the siblings are getting so much attention. She started a camp for families suffering this awful illness. They give out gas cards to ease the financial burden. She has a sweetheart donor giving \$100,000 per year. This is one of the five emphasis areas that LCI has established. #### REPORTING!!

Does your club report membership and activities every month on MyLCI? Do you put your most interesting activities in the ROAR? Do you use the ROAR and Facebook to publicize your activities? If you answered "No"

to any of these, you may want to re-think this. You may not be getting all the benefits of being a Lion of New Hampshire for you and your club.

Let's just take a quick look at why we report to Lions Clubs International on MyLCI. Reporting to LCI Lions Club International keeps track of membership worldwide. This helps us when we want to partner with other foundations to make our impact greater. For example when we partnered with the Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation to work on measles vaccines.

Keeping the information in MyLCI up to date helps the district. This is where we go when we start putting together the directories in the spring and this is where we get the email addresses for sending out the ROAR.

Putting in service activities helps realize our goal of impacting 200,000 people per year.

LCI also compiles a lot of research on Lions. For instance, on average each Lion impacts approximately 70 people per year. Without the reporting we would not get some of these insights.

Also, before the District Governors visit your club, they may try to look up your membership and activities to see what you do. It helps them prepare for their visit. It also helps the Leadership Team know if there may be clubs that need a little extra help. These are just a few reasons to report on MyLCI every month. There are lots of others.

Next month let's talk about using the ROAR and Facebook to promote the wonderful things your club does.


