usings from DG Fred Plett

This is being written just before Midwinter convention in Nashua. We hope to see many of you there. We wish FVDG Sue Lindberg felicitations as she attends the Lions Certified Instructor Program in Toronto this same weekend.

Prior to our upcoming Cabinet meeting on March 3rd at the Puritan in Manchester (doors open at 8:30am), there will be a special meeting of the District 44N Past and Present District Governors, and the 44N Cabinet (invitations to be sent) at the same location, at 8 am. The special meeting is to fill the vacant position of Second Vice District Governor for the remainder of this year. PDG Alan Ricard has stepped forward willing to fill this position. Others who are qualified for the position could also be nominated.

As we enter the last half of this year, we ask the clubs to keep in mind the District 44N Project, the purchase of equipment for Camp Allen. We have \$1,800 in hand, and we are aware of another \$500 that will be presented at that March Cabinet meeting, for a total of \$2,300, and we need to raise \$10,000 total from the clubs to match a \$10,000 grant request from LCIF. This money will be spent on a new utility vehicle and two new golf carts, in constant use at the camp.

For those who wish to be trained as a Guiding Lion, the training is taking place at Delta Dental in Concord on February 9th. We have quite a list of attendees so far, but we have room for a few more.

As we continue club visits, we are in awe of all of the service the clubs are doing for their communities. Keep up the great work.

(May 17, 1949 - January 20, 2019)



Frank Joseph DiChiara Jr. 69, a longtime Merrimack resident passed away at his home on Sunday January 20, 2019. He was born on May 17,1949 in Chelsea Ma, a son of the late Frank Joseph DiChiara Sr. and Elaine (McCarthy) Therrien. Frank attended St. Rose Parochial School in Chelsea MA. where he also served as an Altar Boy.

He was a Graduate of Sanborn Regional High School in Kingston, NH where he was Class President for 4 years and played Baseball, Basketball, Football, and Track and Field.

He played in the 1968 Shriner's Maple Sugar Bowl Game. He Graduated from the University of New Hampshire in 1972 with a B.S. in Physical Education and taught in the Tyngsboro School District in Tyngsboro MA. Frank coached football at his former High School and was an Assistant Football Coach in Tyngsboro as well as Girls Track. He coached MYA for his children in Soccer, Baseball, Basketball, and Pop Warner Football.

Along with his parents, Frank was pre-deceased by his step-father Arthur Therrien and his brother Walter Glowacki. He is survived by his loving wife Michele (Brown) DiChiara of 46 years; three children, Kendra A. DiChiara and her companion Adam Jump of Nashua NH; Kaitlin A. Day and her husband Troy Day from ME; and Anthony F. DiChiara from FL; two grandchildren, Carver Lavigne of Nashua and Aaralyn Day of Farmingdale, ME; and his step-mother Beverly Di Chiara. Frank has a sister Bernadine DiChiara and her wife Christine DiChiara of Merrimack. A sister and Brother-in-Law, Pat and Frank Smidth of FL; as well as several nephews and nieces.

Michele and Frank owned Michele's Restaurant and Catering in Merrimack from 1993 to 2005. Most recently from 2005 to present Frank worked in his company FJD Sales as an Independent Manufacturer's Sales Representative.

Frank was the current President of the Merrimack Lion's club. He has been an active member for 42 years.

Frank and Michele were Communicants at Our Lady of Mercy Parish. Frank was a strong "To The Point Guy" with great Knowledge and passion for sports especially his Boston Red Sox, New England Patriots, Celtics, and Bruins.

Honest, Hardworking with a "Dry sense of Humor", "Quick Come Backs ", and a Big Heart, he will be greatly missed by his Family, Friends, and Business Associates. LIONS QUEST

The History of Lions Quest The ideas behind Lions Quest date back to 1975, when a teenager named Rick Little set out on a "quest" to help other young people develop the skills and strength of character needed to succeed as adults. Rick conducted a survey of over 2,000 high school students to determine the issues that concerned them most and consulted experienced teachers who suggested including a teacher workshop which would serve as a classroom model. The program was so successful at the high school level that soon middle and elementary schools were asking for age appropriate positive youth development programs.

Little eventually founded and served as chief executive officer of the International Youth Foundation. In 1984, Lions Clubs International Foundation (LCIF) gave its first grant to Quest International to help further expand the program. From that point, support of Quest became a key tenet of LCIF's service to youth. For the next eighteen years, LCIF supported Quest at the organizational level through grants and technical collaboration, and at the local level through club involvement in community implementation of the program in schools. Lions have been key to the success and expansion of Lions Quest, supporting the program through local funding, coordinating teacher training, co-hosting parent meetings, speaking to youth, and undertaking joint service projects with students.




